
A CHARITY THAT EVANGELIZES: PARISH-BASED KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCILS

Since its founding by a parish priest — Father Michael McGivney in 1882 — the Knights of Columbus has been dedicated to serving the Catholic Church. To date, its members have volunteered millions of hours and raised billions of dollars for worthy causes. With more than 1.9 million members worldwide, Knights have served their faith, communities and each other in times of need. Whether locally or globally, the influence that the organization's members have had on society as a whole has been extraordinary.

- A Knights of Columbus council in a parish is the gateway to an international organization of more than 1.9 million members.
